Verbal warning of dangling clothes. • Demonstration of knife/grater use • Checking with staff for allergies prior to session start • Good maintenance of equipment – knives etc. • Mobile phones / first aid kit for each group when in town • Verbal warning of stairs in the lamb inn • Fire extinguishers in dining area • Check story tellers and visitors are CRB checked as appropriate.
